
## Robert W. Baral\*St Kateri Tekakwitha\*Lily of The Mohawks\*7/14/2021 AD\*p 1

Saint Kateri Tekakwitha, Virgin, 'Lily of The Mohawks' (1656 - 1680 AD)

"Kateri Tekakwitha, the 'Lily of the Mohawks,' was born to a Mohawk [American Indian] father and a Christian Algonquin [American Indian] mother in the village of Ossernenon [upstate New York, USA].

Shortly after her Baptism at the age of twenty [baptized "Catherine" after Catherine of Siena], she moved to the Saint Francis Xavier mission near Montreal [Canada]. It was said that she know only two paths: to the chapel and to her work.

She lived by the motto, "Who will teach me what is most pleasing to GOD, that I may do it?" The Jesuit Priests of the mission marveled at her deep prayer life, purity and desire for mortification. She died at the age of twenty-four in 1680 and was canonized in 2012."
