
Saints Perpetua, Felicity & Companions, Martyrs (died c 203 AD)

"An authentic account of the Martyrdom of Perpetua and Felicity comes down to us, much of it written by Perpetua herself. A twenty-two-year-old married noblewoman, she was arrested with the slave Felicity and three Christian men" for the crime against the state of refusing to worship the Roman Emperor.

"After relinquishing her infant son, she professed her Faith before the proconsul and her own pagan father. When asked, "Are you a Christian?" she replied simply: "Yes, I am." All five were sentenced to mauling and execution in the amphitheater.

Felicity, a slave woman, was with child when the sentence was announced. She confessed to her companions her fear that she would be separated from them, for it was against the law for a pregnant woman to undergo such punishment.

The Christians then prayed together and immediately labor pains came upon Felicity. She bore a little daughter who was carried from the prison to her sister. Thus, Felicity and Perpetua went together to face the bloodthirsty crowd.

An anonymous eyewitness takes up the account and tells how the women bravely bore the attacks of a mad heifer. After the beast had sported with them, the women and their companions were put to death by the sword.

Perpetua was able to communicate a final message to her brother: "Stand fast in The Faith, love one another, and don't let our suffering upset you." Merciful Father, through the intercession of Saints Perpetua and Felicity, grant me companions in my moments of trial." \*
