
Saint Columbanus of Bobbio, Evangelist & Abbot (540 - 615 AD)

"...the great monastic founder Saint Columbanus was born in Ireland the same year that Saint Benedict died. He was formed at the monastery at Bangor under Saint Comgall.

In his forties, Columbanus left Ireland on mission with twelve companions. Passing through England, he settled in Burgandy, where he carved out of the wilderness three great monastic foundations: Annegray, Luxeuil and Fontaines.

At each place Columbanus prescribed perpetual singing of GOD's praise (Laus Perinnis), in alternating choirs, and a rigorous monastic rule.

After a time, a conflict arose between Columbanus and the Frankish Queen Brunhild, who was the power behind the throne of her grandson Theodoric II. Fed up with Colambanus' chastisements of Theodoric's scandalous lifestyle, Brunhild insisted on sending the Irish-born Monks home.

But when the ship that was to transport them had to return to port because of bad weather, the captain, wary of his task, set the Monks at liberty. Columbanus led them across France, over the Alps, and into Lombardy, where he founded a monastery at Bobbio. He died there about two years later.

The Monasteries founded by Columbanus enjoyed a wide influence throughout Europe. Bobbio was a center of scholarship, and Luxeuil is believed to have produced sixty-three founders, who among themselves established over one hundred Monasteries." *

- 9 The LORD also will be a refuge for the oppressed, a refuge in times of trouble.

- 11 Sing praises to The LORD, which dwelleth in Zion: declare among the people his doings.
- 12 When He maketh inquisition for blood, He remembereth them: He forgetteth not the cry of the humble.
- 13 Have mercy upon me, O LORD; consider my trouble which I suffer of them that hate me, Thou that liftest me up from the gates of death:
- 14 That I may shew forth all Thy praise in the gates of the daughter of Zion: I will rejoice in Thy salvation.

- 19 Arise, O LORD; let not man prevail: let the heathen be judged in Thy sight.
- 20 Put them in fear, O LORD: that the nations may know themselves to be but men. Selah.
