
<u>Robert W. Baral*St Jerome*translated Bible into Latin Vulgate*9/30/2021 AD*p 1</u>

Saint Jerome, Priest, monk, theologian, Bible scholar & translator, Doctor of The Church (342 - 420 AD)

"A native of Italy, Jerome was educated in the Latin and Greek classics. As an adult, he received baptism and embarked on a life of solitary penance in the desert of Calchis [in present day nation of Georgia].

Under Pope Damasus I, Jerome revised the then current translation of The Bible, producing The Vulgate [from Greek and Hebrew, into the then vernacular Latin], The Church's official biblical Text.

In later years, Jerome founded a monastic community in the Holy Land, where he composed commentaries on The Scriptures: "I beg of you, dear brother," he wrote to a friend, "to live among These [Holy] Books, to meditate upon them, to know nothing else, to seek nothing else. Does not such a life seem to you a foretaste of Heaven here on earth?"" *
