

Saint Spyridon of Cyprus (270 - 348 AD)

"Spyridon was a native of northeast Cyprus, near Salamis. He grew up tending the sheep, and in this silent and solitary work, a habit of prayer was formed. His reputation for sanctity was so great, that when it came time to elect a new Bishop, Spyridon was chosen. Even as he embraced his episcopal duties, he still spent time on the hillsides guarding the sheep.

In some sources Spyridon is identified as "Spyridon the Wonderworker." One particular miracle associated with him occurred when a band of thieves came at night to steal one of his prized rams. When the robbers tried to make off with the ram, they found themselves unable to move.

Spyridon found them in the morning and gained their liberty by his prayers. He forgave them for their crime and offered to send them off with one of his rams, "so that you may not have watched all night in vain."

When persecutions began under the emperor Galerius Maximian, Spyridon was punished by having his eye gouged out and the sinews of his leg severed. Thus debilitated, he was sent to work in the copper mines - a veritable death sentence.

Yet he survived the ordeal and returned to his flock for a time before his death. Spyridon is the patron [Saint] of Corfu [Cyprus]. Loving Father, through the intercession of Saint Spyridon, make me capable of unexpected generosity." * AMEN.
