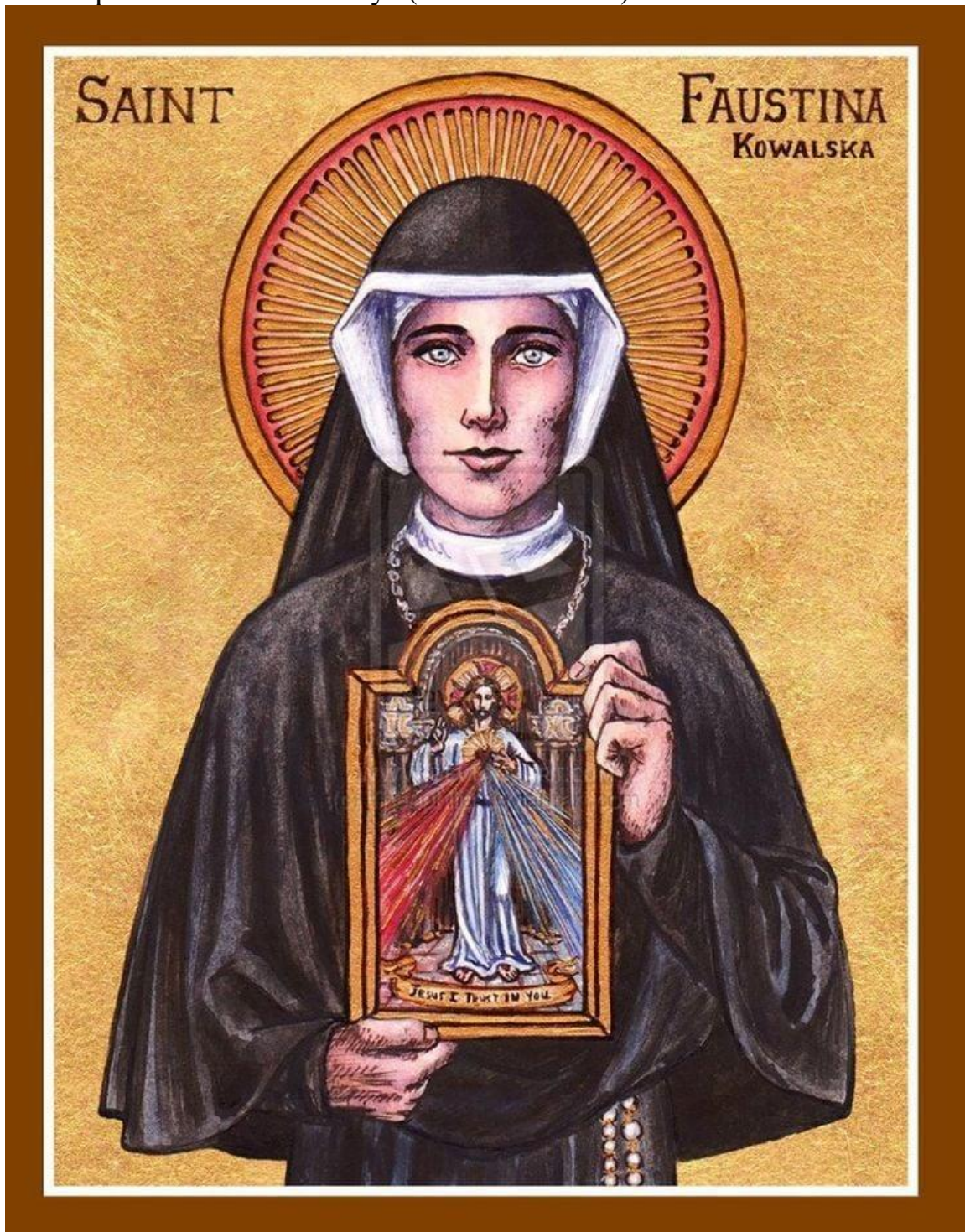


Saint Sister Faustina Kowalska of The Blessed Sacrament

"The daughter of Polish peasants, Helena Kowalska entered the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy as "Mary Faustina" in 1925. After two years of spiritual aridity, she began to receive visions of JESUS in luminous array, red and white rays streaming from His pierced side.

"I AM send you with My Mercy to the people of the whole world," He told her. "I do not want to punish aching mankind, but I desire to heal it, press it to My Merciful Heart."

She gave herself totally to the task of communicating CHRIST's Mercy, even offering her own painful death at thirty-three for the salvation of souls. Pope John Paul II canonized Faustina in 2000." *
