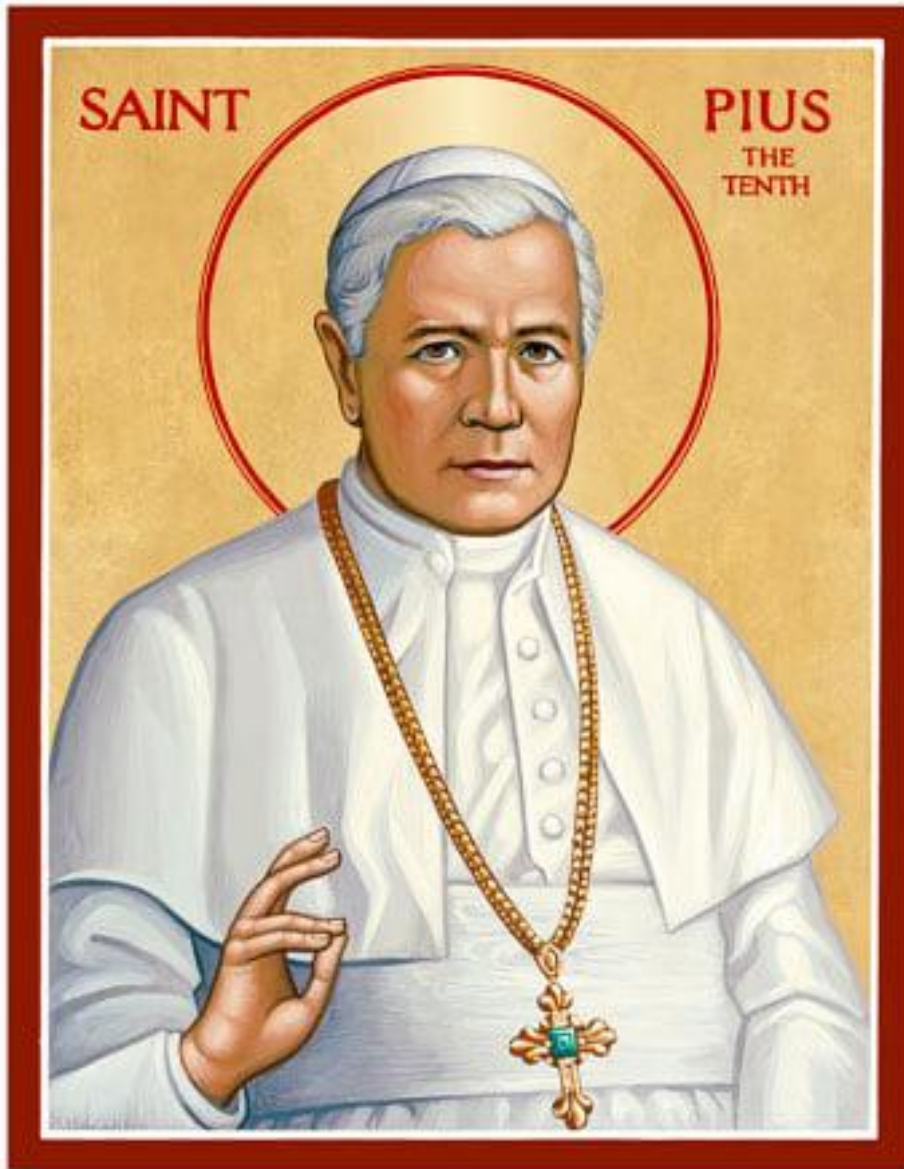


Saint Pope Pius X (1835 - 1914 AD) – The Pope of The Eucharist

Saint Pius X served as The Vicar of our Lord on earth from 1903 to 1914. He is often remembered as "The Pope of The Eucharist" for promoting widespread and frequent pious reception of Holy Communion by the Laity. Ever a fervent foe of the demonic lies of "modernism," ever ministering, preaching, teaching and caring, his motto was taken from Saint Paul in EPHESIANS 1:10, "to restore all things in CHRIST." \*

The faithful Church Militant - The Body of our Redeemer JESUS CHRIST on earth - is called to bring souls to our Savior and extend The Kingdom of GOD in this realm by preaching, teaching and acting on The Gospel. "Modernism" offers a secular temporal pseudo-salvation as a false ape of The True Gospel, ever trying to degrade The Church into its own fallen image.

Saint Pope Pius X knew that The Church does not accomplish Her calling by becoming more like the world, but by transforming the world - by The Power of Divine Grace, Word, Sacraments and The HOLY SPIRIT - into The Kingdom of GOD on earth.

"Perhaps nowhere in the history of The Church is there a better example of a man possessed of so many of the saintly virtues - piety, charity, deep humility, pastoral zeal, and simplicity - than in one of the newest of GOD's elect, St. Pius X. Yet the parish Priest of Tombolo [Italy], who remained a country Priest at heart throughout his life, faced the problems and evils of a strife-torn world with the spiritual fervor of a Crusader."\*

"Born in 1835 in the village of Riese, Italy, to a seamstress mother and cobbler father, Giuseppe Sarto spent most of his priestly life ministering to the people in and around Venice. As Pastor, he gave to the poor from his own modest household.

As Bishop of Mantua and then Patriarch of Venice, he reformed lax seminaries, yet still found time to teach catechism to children. Elected Pope Pius X in 1903, he led The Church with forthright teachings on the importance of catechesis, Catholic Action, and the errors of modernism..."

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Heartbroken at being unable to prevent WWI, he died one month after that terrible war's onset. His tomb in is inscribed, "Born poor and humble of heart, Undaunted champion of The Catholic Faith, Zealous to restore all things in CHRIST, Crowned a holy life with a holy death." \*
